Quick Installation Guide

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1. Package Contents

Thanks you for purchasing PLANET L2+ 48-Port 10/100/1000BASE-T + 4-Port 1000X SFP Managed Gigabit Switch, WGSW-52040. **"Managed Switch"** is also used to refer to the WGSW-52040 in this quick installation guide.

Open the box of the **Managed Switch** and carefully unpack it. The box should contain the following items:

- The Managed Switch x 1
- Quick Installation Guide x 1
- RJ45-to-DB9 Console Cable x 1
- Power Cord x 1
- Rubber Feet x 4
- Two Rack-mounting Brackets with Attachment Screws x 1
- SFP Dust Cap x 4

If any item is found missing or damaged, please contact your local reseller for replacement

2. Switch Management

To set up the Managed Switch, the user needs to configure the Managed Switch for network management. The Managed Switch provides two management options: Out-of-Band Management and In-Band Management.

■ Out-of-Band Management

Out-of-band management is the management through Console interface. **Generally, the user will use out-of-band management for the initial switch configuration**, or when in-band management is not available.

IMPORTANT!

The Managed Switch is shipped without IP address assigned by default. User must assign an IP address to the Managed Switch via the Console interface to be able to remotely access the Managed Switch through Telnet or HTTP.

■ In-Band Management

In-band management refers to the management by logging in to the Managed Switch using Telnet or HTTP, or using SNMP management software to configure the Managed Switch. In-band management enables the management of the Managed Switch to attach some devices to the Switch. The following procedures are required to enable In-band management:

1. Logon to console
2. Assign / Configure IP address
3. Create a remote login account
4. Enable HTTP or Telnet server on the Managed Switch

In case in-band management fails due to Managed Switch configuration changes, out-of-band management can be used for configuring and managing the Managed Switch.

3. Requirements

- Workstations running Windows XP/2003/Vista/7/8/2008, MAC OS X or later, Linux, UNIX, or other platforms are compatible with TCP/IP protocols.
- Workstations are installed with Ethernet NIC (Network Interface Card)
- **Serial Port Connection** (Terminal)
 - The above Workstations come with COM Port (DB9) or USB-to-RS-232 converter.
 - The above Workstations have been installed with terminal emulator, such as Hyper Terminal included in Windows XP/2003.
 - Serial cable -- one end is attached to the RS-232 serial port, while the other end to the console port of the Managed Switch.
- **Ethernet Port Connection**
 - Network cables -- Use standard network (UTP) cables with RJ45 connectors.
 - The above PC is installed with Web browser and JAVA runtime environment plug-in.



Note

It is recommended to use Internet Explore 8.0 or above to access the Managed Switch. If the Web interface of the Managed Switch is not accessible, please turn off the anti-virus software or firewall and then try it again.

4. Terminal Setup

To configure the system, connect a serial cable to a **COM port** on a PC or notebook computer and to serial (console) port of the Managed Switch. The console port of the Managed Switch is DCE already, so that you can connect the console port directly through PC without the need of Null Modem.

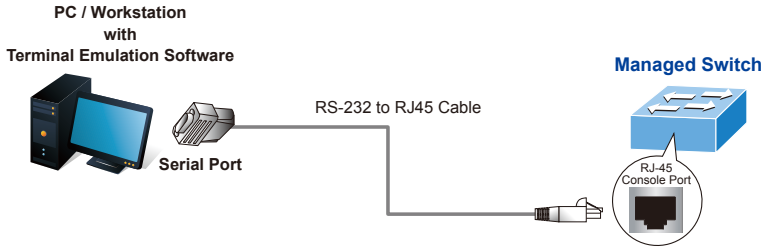


Figure 4-1 Managed Switch Console Connectivity

A terminal program is required to make the software connection to the Managed Switch. Windows' Hyper Terminal program may be a good choice. The Hyper Terminal can be accessed from the Start menu.

1. Click **START** menu, then **Programs, Accessories** and then **Hyper Terminal**.
2. Type a name for opening Hyper Terminal, such as **"COM1_9600"**.
3. When the following screen appears, make sure that the COM port should be configured as:

- Baud : 9600
- Parity : None
- Data bits : 8
- Stop bits : 1
- Flow control : None

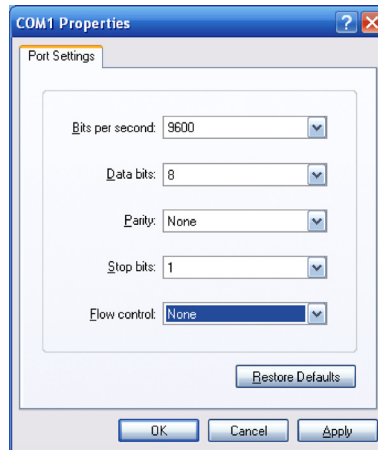



Figure 4-2 Hyper Terminal COM Port Configuration

5. Logon to the Console

Once the terminal is connected to the device, power on the Managed Switch, and the terminal will display “running testing procedures”.

Then, the following message asks the login user name and password. The factory default user name and password are as follows as the login screen in Figure 5-1 appears.

The user can now enter commands to manage the Switch. For a detailed description for the commands, please refer to the following chapters.



Note

1. For security reason, please change and memorize the new password after this first setup.
2. Only accept command in lowercase letter under console interface.

6. Configuring IP Address


The IP address configuration commands for VLAN1 interface are listed below. Before using in-band management, the Managed Switch must be configured with an IP address by out-of-band management (i.e. console mode). The configuration commands are as follows (All switch configuration prompts are assumed to be "WGSW-52040" hereafter if not otherwise specified):

```
WGSW-52040> enable
WGSW-52040# config
WGSW-52040(config)# interface vlan 1
WGSW-52040(Config-if-Vlan1)# ip address 192.168.1.254 255.255.255.0
```

The previous command would apply the follow settings for the Managed Switch.

IPv4 Address: **192.168.1.254**

Subnet Mask: **255.255.255.0**





To check the current IP address or modify a new IP address for the Managed Switch, please use the procedures as follows:

■ Show the current IP address

1. On "WGSW-52040#" prompt, enter "show ip interface brief".
2. The screen displays the current IP address, Subnet Mask and Gateway as shown in Figure 6-2.

If the IP is successfully configured, the Managed Switch will apply the new IP address setting immediately. You can access the Web interface of Managed Switch through the new IP address.



Note

If you are not familiar with console command or the related parameter, enter "**help**" anytime in console to get the help description.

7. Starting Web Management

The Managed Switch provides a built-in browser interface. You can manage it remotely by having a remote host with Web browser, such as Microsoft Internet Explorer, Mozilla Firefox, Google Chrome or Apple Safari.

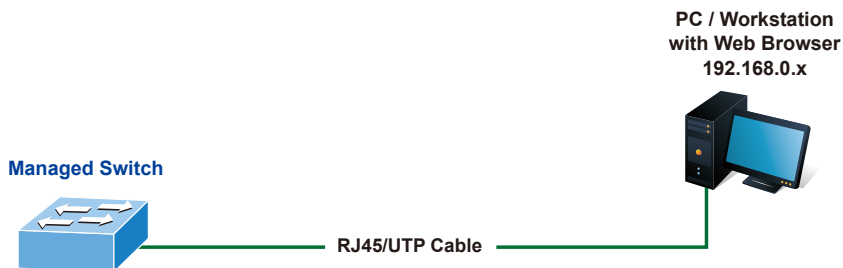


Figure 7-1 IP Management Diagram

The following shows how to start up the **Web Management** of the Managed Switch. Please note the Managed Switch is configured through an Ethernet connection. Please make sure the manager PC must be set on the same **IP subnet address**.

For example, the IP address of the Managed Switch is configured with **192.168.1.254**, then the manager PC should be set at **192.168.1.x** (where x is a number between 1 and 253, except 254), and the default subnet mask is 255.255.255.0.

The factory default user name and password are as follows:



8. Saving the Configuration

In Managed Switch, the running configuration file stores in the RAM. In the current version, the running configuration sequence running-config can be saved from the RAM to FLASH by **write** command or **copy running-config startup-config** startup-config command, so that the running configuration sequence becomes the start up configuration file, which is called configuration save.

9. Login the Managed Switch

1. Use Internet Explorer 7.0 or above Web browser and enter IP address **http://192.168.1.254** (that you have just set in console) to access the Web interface.

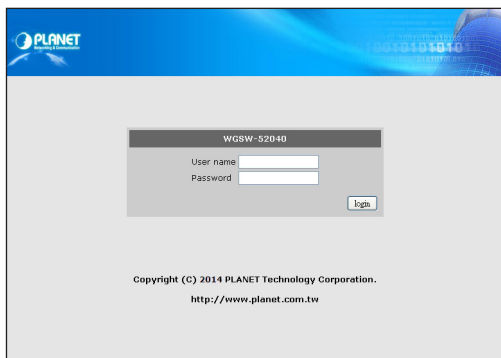


Figure 9-1 Login screen

2. When the following dialog box appears, please enter the configured username **“admin”** and password **“admin”** (or the username / password you have changed via console). The login screen in Figure 9-1 appears.

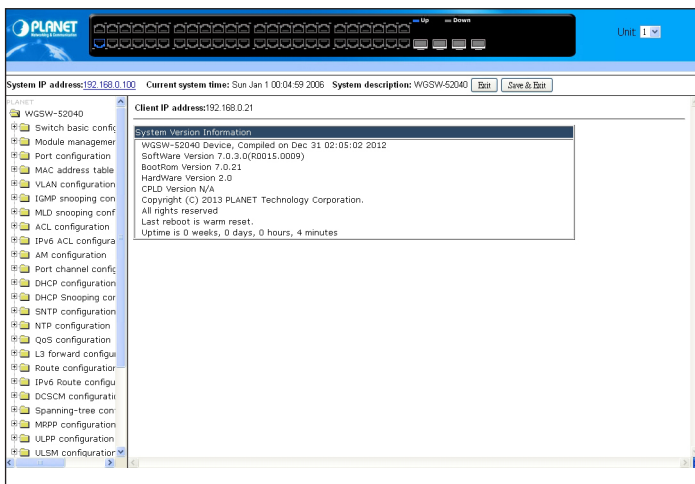


Figure 9-2 Web Main Screen of Managed Switch

3. After entering the password, the main screen appears as shown in Figure 9-2.

4. The Switch Menu on the left of the Web page lets you access all the commands and statistics the Switch provides.
